HIS HONOUR: Taking all these matters into account, the orders of the court are:

- 1. The company is convicted and fined \$120,000 with a victim's levy of \$1000.
- 2. The defendant will, pursuant to s 239 of the *Work Health and Safety (National Uniform Legislation) Act*, within two months of the date of these orders, contribute \$10,000 to the complainant for the preparation, publication and distribution of written advice regarding precautions to be undertaken by tourists in central Australia in respect of weather conditions.
- 3. The defendant is to pay to complainant's costs.

Mr Wild, what are those costs? Have they been determined?

MR WILD: Yes, your Honour. Your Honour, if I could seek leave to be seated while I address you. I think my head disappears above the camera. The costs have been agreed between the parties separately and that amount was \$23,249, your Honour.

HIS HONOUR: The defendant has to pay the complainant's costs, fixed at \$23,349 on or before - - -

MR STIRK: It has already happened, your Honour.

HIS HONOUR: It has happened, has it?

MR WILD: Yes, it has, your Honour.

HIS HONOUR: Well, I will make the order in any event. On or before 29 October 2021. Yes, is there anything further?

MR WILD: Just – sorry, your Honour. There was just one thing. That figure on the costs was \$23,249, not 349.

HIS HONOUR: Okay. 249, thank you. Anything further?

MS WILD: No, your Honour.

HIS HONOUR: Mr Stirk?

MR STIRK: No, your Honour.

HIS HONOUR: Thank you. We will adjourn.
