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Function of the Work Health and Safety Advisory Council

The Work Health and Safety Advisory Council (the Council) is established under the Work Health and Safety (National Uniform Legislation) Act 2011 (the Act) to carry out the following functions in accordance with schedule 2(3) of the Act:

- Keep under review the operation of the Act.
- Make recommendations to the Minister on possible changes to the administration of the Act or standards of work health and safety in the Northern Territory.
- At the Ministers request, investigate and report on matters relating to work health and safety.
- Perform any other advisory functions relating to work health and safety as the Minister directs.

Meetings of the Work Health and Safety Advisory Council

In accordance with schedule 2(9) of the Act, the Council must meet when directed by the Minister to do so, and at any other time the Chair considers appropriate.

Membership of the Work Health and Safety Advisory Council

In accordance with schedule 2(4) of the Act, the Council membership consists of:

- The Work Health Authority.
- Not more than 10 other persons appointed by the Minister, which includes:
 - Persons with a wide range of experience extending as far as possible across all major industry sectors in the Territory, and
 - o As far as is practicable, consists of equal numbers of representatives of organisations representing employees.

Committees

Under section 10 of the Act the Council may establish committees to assist it to carry out its functions.

During 2020-2021, The Council established an Injured Workers and Family Forum as per Recommendation 4 of the Best Practice Review of Work Health and Safety in the Northern Territory:

Injured Workers and Family Forum

The Committee considered the following recommendation from the 'Best Practice Review of Workplace Health and Safety in the Northern Territory':

Recommendation 4: That an Injured Workers and Family Forum be established, actively supported, and consulted by both NT WorkSafe and the Work Health and Safety Advisory Council.

Recommendation 5: That NT WorkSafe develop a more effective system to ensure that the families and victims of fatalities are supported, modelled on best practice used by police services.

Findings and recommendations were sent to the Minister by the Chairs of both councils for the Ministers consideration.

Planned Activities of the Advisory Council for 2022-2023

Proposed work to be undertaken by the Council in 2022-2023 include:

- Continue to consider and identify if there are any activities that the Council can undertake relating to the recommendations from the Best Practice Review of Work Health and Safety in the Northern Territory referred to the Council;
- The Work Health and Safety Advisory Council monitor trends in relation to prosecutions in relation to the number of proceedings, success rate and penalties awarded;
- Review the 34 recommendations of the Model Work Health and Safety Laws Final Report and identify if there are any actions that the Council should consider; and
- Consider if a review of the Industrial Manslaughter legislation in the Northern Territory is to be conducted.
